

UNESCO and Pakistan Science Foundation commemorate the World Science Day under the theme “Celebrating Science Centers and Science Museums”

Islamabad - 15 November 2016: UNESCO Islamabad together with Pakistan Science Foundation (PSF) jointly organized an event on the occasion of World Science Day 2016 at the Pakistan Museum of Natural History in Islamabad. The theme for this years' was 'Celebrating Science Centers and Science Museums'. The event aimed to create awareness on the importance of WSD and to encourage students towards scientific education and research and to provide them with a platform to share ideas between the scientists and students.



The event was attended by officials and representatives of the Ministry of Science and Technology, PSF, ECOSF, Embassy of France, British Council, UNESCO, and academia and research institutions in Pakistan.

At the end of the event, PSF Gold Medals, certificates and cash prizes co-sponsored by PSF and UNESCO were distributed among the winner students of Inter-Board Competitions.



World Science Day was first declared by UNESCO in 2001 and since then it is celebrated worldwide on 10th of November each year. It offers an opportunity to demonstrate to the wider public why science is relevant to their daily lives and to engage them in debate on related issues. Every year, intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations, scientific research institutions, professional associations, universities, municipalities, the media, science teachers, schools and others are encouraged to organize their own celebration of World Science Day.
